The New Year Brings Change to the SPR Guide

The Spokane Public Radio *Program Guide* has been around for almost as long as KPBX. Over the years it has been through many changes, starting in 1980 with just the listings of monthly programs printed in *Spokane Magazine*, to its recent version of extensive program, event, and station features and articles.

The winds have again shifted, and the time has come for the station to make a change in the way information is passed to our members, listeners, and the public at large. This change is occurring after much thought and research over the past three years. We realize that this will affect some of you who really enjoy having your opera and jazz listings immediately on hand, however, the cost and time of producing a print edition of our beloved publication has proved inefficient given that more of you choose to receive your *Guide* via email link, through our website, or not at all than those of you who want a hard copy sent to your

mailbox. Since 2008, the amount of printed SPR *Guides* has been reduced by over half. This has been a national trend due to a more tech-savvy generation of listener, members opting to save us money, and stations allocating more operational resources towards developing digital and electronic forms of media.

This new streamlined *Guide* will inform you of program changes, quarterly events, volunteer needs, and technical issues. Its reduced size will save us in both printing and mailing costs and many of the pages can be clipped and posted for easy reference. All of the information you have been accustomed to (program listings, event features, staff bios, photos, and more) can be found on our new website, which is maintained daily as changes occur.
